Abstract and Objectives:

Whether activities carried out abroad can amount to infringement within a jurisdiction where a patent is in force has occupied courts for a long time.

As cross-border and dislocated activities continue to increase, the territoriality principle underpinning patent law has been questioned. Increasingly cloud-based services and the use of standard-essential technologies challenge this territorial nature of patent rights. Is it possible to shield (contributory) infringing activities from the scope of a domestic patent by carrying them out abroad? Is it possible to request injunctive relief in respect of a domestic defendant in respect of a patent infringed in a foreign patent? Is a FRAND undertaking a matter of contract that empowers a court to determine a global license and issue an anti-suit injunction in the process of doing so?
